Want to dine with a view of the city and not blow your entire trip fund? Rome has numerous options for panoramic picnic spots and first and foremost is the **Orange Garden** on the Aventine Hill. With blossoming trees,

welcoming benches, a convenient water fountain and a view of St. Peter's in the distance, it doesn't get much better than this. The Janiculum Hill offers grassy knolls galore for patriotic picnickers. In the shadow of the statue of Italian



hero Giuseppe Garibaldi, and along curving lanes lined with busts of the biggest names of the Risorgimento, find yourself a cozy spot to spread a blanket, cork open a bottle of Frascati wine and watch the afternoon sun turn the Eternal City golden.

For a gourmet meal, book a table at the incomparable Terrazza dell'Eden, with a panorama that is just as paradisiacal as its name suggests. Versatile head chef Fabio Ciervo combines the best of Italian, French, Spanish and Asian cuisine to create an innovative and tempting menu. You'll feel like a celebrity dining on the **Imago** terrace of the world-famous Hassler **Hotel**. This luxurious restaurant with its stunning view of the Trinità dei Monti Church and Piazza di Spagna from above was the first in Rome to offer rooftop dining. The jewel of the Hilton Hotel is without a doubt its award-winning restaurant, La Pergola, situated atop Monte Mario. Views through the massive windows will make your head spin but even more exceptional is the menu, created by one of the world's most famous chefs, Heinz Beck. Across town at Hotel Bernini, the magnificent Olimpo offers a completely different perspective of the towering cupolas of the city with an equally surprising menu of modern twists on traditional favorites.



Aroma, with a chic, modern interior and mouth-watering dishes, gives its diners an unmatchable view of the Colosseum. At the Hotel Crowne Plaza Minerva you will feel like you are dining on top of the Pantheon, as it is just a few meters away. The view is picture-perfect, with the domes of St. Peter, Sant'Ivo and Sant'Andrea della Valle lining up to create a perspective

that has been featured on many a postcard. Last but not least, the stunning terrace of **Mirabelle** at the **Hotel Splendide Royal** just off Via Veneto provides sweeping views of the entire city and a tempting menu by new head chef Daniele Sera.
